

# Laptop Sleeve

A laptop sleeve is the perfect accessory for use at home or on the go. When you want to protect your laptop from scratches but don't want the bulk of a full case, look no further! The silky soft flannel on the inside will snuggle your laptop and protect from even the slightest scratch.



## Materials

- Yellow fabric: 1 FQ
- Linen: 1 FQ
- Lining: 1 FQ flannel
- 10 x (2¼-inch) sqs (or as required for step three)
- Fusible fleece: ½ yd

## Finished Measurements

- Adjust to fit your laptop

## Instructions

- 1 Measure your laptop and make a note of the width, height, and depth. For example, my 13-inch laptop is W: 12¼ inches x H: 8¾ inches x D: ¾ inch.
- 2 Work out the cutting size for your laptop sleeve following the simple formula below:  
Height = W + D + 1 inch (14 inches for my case)  
Width = H + D + 1 inch (10½ inches for my case).
- 3 Cut two lining pieces and two fusible fleece pieces at the size calculated.
- 4 Cut two strips from linen fabric measuring 2¼ inches x W. Piece the 10 sqs into two strips of five and join to the linen fabric strip. Press to the linen. Note: If the patchwork strip is shorter than the linen strip, you will need to add another square.
- 5 Measure the height of your patchwork piece (A); it should be 5½ inches. Cut main panels at width x (height—A + ½ inch), i.e. 10½ x 9 inches.
- 6 Join main panel to patchwork panel. Press to the patchwork panel. Fuse to the fleece and quilt as desired.
- 7 Place main panel pieces RST and sew around side and bottom seams with a ¼-inch seam allowance. Repeat for lining leaving a turning gap in the bottom seam.
- 8 Place sleeve inside lining, RST. Sew all the way around the top seam. Clip corners to remove bulk.
- 9 Turn through, press well, and top stitch the top seam. Close turning hole with a slipstitch by hand or top stitch on the machine.
