

# little lamb

This soft hat in neutral cream has an extra-warm neck ruff for the chilliest of days. The matching mittens and leg warmers, with an attractive seed-stitch pattern, will ensure your little one stays really cozy.

**LEVEL:** beginner

## SIZES

6-12 months (12-24 months,  
2-3 years)

## Finished measurements

**From "cheek to cheek" around  
the hat:**

14½ (15, 15½)in. (37 [38, 39]cm)

Mitten circumference: 5½ (6, 6)in.  
(13.75 [15, 15]cm)

**Mitten length:** 5½ (6½, 7½)in.  
(14 [16.5, 19]cm)

**Leg-warmer circumference:** 7  
(8, 8)in. (18 [20, 20]cm)

**Leg-warmer length:** 10 (11, 11½)in.  
(25.5cm [28, 29]cm)

## Gauge

10 sts and 20 rows = 4in. (10cm)  
square in seed stitch worked with  
US 10 (6mm) needles

13 sts and 20 rows = 4in. (10cm)  
square in k1, p1 rib unstretched,  
worked with US 10 (6mm) needles.

## Materials

### HAT

#### Yarn:

2 x 3.5oz (100g) ball (120yd/109m)  
Bernat Roving, 80% acrylic, 20%  
wool, Rice Paper

#### Equipment:

- US 10 (6mm) circular needle
- A pair of US 10 (6mm) needles
- Optional: Stitch marker to  
indicate the start of a round.
- Yarn needle

### MITTENS

#### Yarn:

1 x 3.5oz (100g) ball (120yd/109m)  
Bernat Roving, 80% acrylic, 20%  
wool, Rice Paper

#### Equipment:

- 4 x US 10 (6mm) double-  
pointed needles
- Optional: Stitch marker to  
indicate the start of a round.
- Yarn needle


### LEG WARMERS

#### Yarn:

1 x 3.5oz (100g) ball (120yd/109m)  
Bernat Roving, 80% acrylic, 20%  
wool, Rice Paper

#### Equipment:

- 4 x US 10 (6mm) double-pointed  
needles
- Optional: Stitch marker to  
indicate the start of a round.
- Yarn needle



## HAT

With a US 10 (6mm) circular needle, cast on 50 (52, 54) sts. Join to work in the round.

**Rounds 1-4 (1-4, 1-4):** Work in k1, p1 rib.

**Row 5 (5, 5):** P1, \*k1, p1\* rep. from \* to \* 21 (22, 23) times, place next 7 (7, 7) stitches on waste yarn, turn. 43 (45, 47) sts.

**Row 6 (6, 6):** P1, [k1, p1] rep. to end of round. 43 (45, 47) sts.

**Rows 7-27 (7-29, 7-29):** Rep. row 6. 43 (45, 47) sts. Work short rows.

**6-12 months and 2-3 years:**

**Row 28 (30):** P1, [k1, p1] 6 (7) times, p2tog, [k1, p1] 6 (6) times, k1, p2tog, turn. 41 (45) sts.

**Row 29 (31):** Sl1, [k1, p1] 6 (6) times, k1, k2tog, turn. 40 (44) sts.

**Row 30 (32):** Sl1, [k1, p1] 6 (6) times, k1, p2tog, turn. 39 (43) sts.

**Rows 31-52 (33-58):** Rep. rows 29-30 (31-32), 11 (13) times. 17 (17) sts.

**Row 53 (59):** Rep. row 29 (31) once. 16 (16) sts.

### Neck ruff

Work in the round.

**Round 54 (60):** Sl1, [k1, p1] 6 (6) times, k1, p2tog, pick up and knit 8 (10) sts along edge, from waste yarn, [k1, p1] 3 times, k1, pick up and knit 8 (10) sts along edge. 38 (42) sts.

**Round 55 (61):** [K1, p1] rep. to end of round. 38 (42) sts.

**Round 56 (62):** [P1, k1] rep. to end of round. 38 (42) sts.

**Rounds 57-86 (63-92):** Rep. rounds 55-56 (61-62), 15 (15) times. 38 (42) sts.

**Rounds 87-94 (93-100):** Work in k1, p1 rib. 38 (42) sts. Bind off.

**12-24 months:**

**Row 30:** P1, [k1, p1] 6 times, k1, p2tog, [p1, k1] 6 times, p1, p2tog, turn. 43 sts.

**Row 31:** Sl1, [p1, k1] 6 times, p1, k2tog, turn. 42 sts.

**Row 32:** Sl1, [p1, k1] 6 times, p1, p2tog, turn. 41 sts.

**Rows 33-56:** Rep. rows 31-32, 12 times. 17 sts.

**Row 57:** Rep. row 31 once. 16 sts. Work in the round.

**Round 58:** Sl1, [p1, k1] 6 times, p1, p2tog, pick up and knit 9 sts along edge, from waste yarn, [k1, p1] 3 times, k1, pick up and knit 9 sts along edge. 40 sts.

**Round 59:** [P1, k1] rep. to end of round. 40 sts.

**Round 60:** [K1, p1] rep. to end of round. 40 sts.

**Rounds 61-88:** Rep. rounds 59-60, 14 times. 40 sts.

**Rounds 89-96:** P1, k1 rib. 40 sts. Bind off.

### EARS

With US 10 (6mm) straight needles, cast on 14 sts.

**Rows 1-9:** Work in garter stitch.

**Row 10:** K1, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 12 sts.

**Rows 11-12:** Work in garter stitch. **Row 13-24:** Rep. rows 10-12, 4 times. 4 sts.

**Row 25:** [K2tog] twice. 2 sts.

**Row 26:** Knit.

**Row 27:** K2tog. 1 st.

Bind off.

## Finishing

- 1 Sew the ears to the hat in position (see page 15) using an invisible seam.
- 2 Weave in ends.

## MITTENS

(make 2)

With US 10 (6mm) double-pointed needles, cast on 16 (18, 18) sts. Join to work in the round.

### CUFF

**Rounds 1-6 (1-8, 1-8):** Work k1, p1 rib.

**Round 7 (9, 9):** [P1, k1] rep. to end of round.

**Round 8 (10, 10):** [K1, p1] rep. to end of round.

### THUMB GUSSET

**Round 9 (11, 11):** K1 (1, 1), m1, k1 (1, 1), [p1, k1] 7 (8, 8) times. 17 (19, 19) sts.

**Round 10 (12, 12):** K4 (4, 4), [p1, k1] 6 (7, 7) times, p1. 17 (19, 19) sts.

**Round 11 (13, 13):** M1, k3 (3, 3), m1, [p1, k1] 7 (8, 8) times. 19 (21, 21) sts.

**Round 12 (14, 14):** K6 (6, 6), [p1, k1] 6 (7, 7) times, p1. 19 (21, 21) sts.

**Round 13 (15, 15):** M1, k5 (5, 5), m1, [p1, k1] 7 (8, 8) times. 21 (23, 23) sts.

**Round 14 (16, 16):** K8 (8, 8), [p1, k1] 6 (7, 7) times, p1. 21 (23, 23) sts.

**Round 15 (17, 17):** M1, k7 (7, 7), m1, [p1, k1] 7 (8, 8) times. 23 (25, 25) sts.

**12-24 months and 2-3 years:**

**Round (18, 18):** K (10, 10), [p1, k1] (7, 7) times, p1. (25, 25) sts.

**Round (19, 19):** M1, k (9, 9), m1, [p1, k1] (8, 8) times. (27, 27) sts.

**All sizes:**

**Round 16 (20, 20):** K1 (1, 1), place 7 (9, 9) thumb stitches on waste yarn. Rejoin to work in the round, [p1, k1] 7 (8, 8) times, p1. 16 (18, 18) sts.

### HAND

**Round 17 (21, 21):** [P1, k1] to end of round.

**Round 18 (22, 22):** [K1, p1] to end of round.

**Rounds 19-23 (23-30, 23-32):** Work in stockinette stitch.

**Round 24 (31, 33):** [K2tog] to end of round. 8 (9, 9) sts.

**Round 25 (32, 34):** Knit.

**Round 26 (33, 35):** [K2tog] 4 (4, 4) times, KO (1, 1). 4 (5, 5) sts. Cut yarn, thread through remaining stitches and draw tight.

### THUMB

Place 7 (9, 9) stitches from waste yarn onto needles. Rejoin yarn and pick up one extra stitch in the corner where mitten meets gusset. 8 (10, 10) sts. Join to work in the round.

**Rounds 1-3 (1-4, 1-5):** Work in stockinette stitch.

**Round 4 (5, 6):** [K2tog] to end of round. 4 (5, 5) sts.

Finish as for mitten Hand.

## LEG WARMERS

(make 2)

With US 10 (6mm) double-pointed needles, cast on 20 (22, 22) sts. Join to work in the round.

### CUFF

**Rounds 1-6 (1-7, 1-7):** Work k1, p1 rib.



### LEG

**Round 7 (8, 8):** [P1, k1] to end of round.

**Round 8 (9, 9):** [K1, p1] to end of round.

**Rounds 9-34 (10-47, 10-51):** Rep. last 2 rounds. 13 (19, 21) times.

### CUFF

**Rounds 35-39 (48-53, 52-57):** P1, k1 rib. Bind off.

## Finishing

- 1 Weave in ends.

The mittens and legwarmers are both knitted using seed stitch—for more details, see page 131.

## bind off

Binding off is the last row of your knitting. Ensure that the bind off is firm but flexible so that hats, mittens, and booties can be easily pulled on and off. Always bind off in the pattern you are using.


### KNIT BIND OFF

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
**1** Knit two stitches as normal. Insert the left-hand needle into the first stitch you knitted on the right-hand needle and lift it over the second stitch, and off the needle.

**2** You now have one stitch on the right-hand needle. Knit the next stitch. Repeat step 1 until you have bound off all of the stitches and have one stitch left on the needle. Pull the yarn through the last stitch to fasten off.

### PURL BIND OFF

#### PURL BIND OFF

**1** Purl two stitches as normal. Insert the left-hand needle into the back of the first stitch you knitted on the right-hand needle and lift it over the second stitch, and off the needle.

**2** You now have one stitch on the right-hand needle. Purl the next stitch. Repeat step 1 until you have bound off all of the stitches and have one stitch left on the needle. Pull the yarn through the last stitch to fasten off.

# knitting stitches

### STOCKINETTE STITCH


This is the most common pattern in *More Monster Knits*. To create stockinette stitch, knit alternate knit and purl rows. In this book, the knit side is the right side of the fabric.

Cast on the number of stitches required.


**Row 1:** Knit.

**Row 2:** Purl.

Repeats rows 1 and 2 to form stockinette stitch.

DOUBLE RIB STITCH


### SINGLE RIB STITCH

*More Monster Knits* patterns use k1 p1 rib (single rib). You make the rib by alternating knit and purl stitches in the row, to create vertical columns of knit and purl stitches. The rib has an elastic quality that makes it suitable for areas that need to stretch, such as mitten cuffs.


Cast on an even number of stitches.

**Row 1:** \*K1, p1, repeat from \* to end.

Repeat this row to form a single rib pattern.

GARTER STITCH

### GARTER STITCH

To make garter stitch, use knit stitch for all the rows.

Cast on the number of stitches required.

**Row 1:** Knit.


Repeat row 1 to form garter stitch.

### SEED STITCH

Seed stitch is usually worked on an odd number of stitches.

**Row 1:** (right side): \*K1, p1\* end k1.

**Row 2:** Repeat row 1.
